Enhance the Appearance of Your Property



Property Maintenance

As the Rules Committee has recently received violation reports for unmaintained properties throughout the community, it would like to once again remind all property owners of their responsibility for the upkeep and maintenance of their property.

Trees, shrubs, and all plantings as well as grass/yard cover are to be maintained to enhance the appearance of the dwelling. Major yard areas are to be continually covered with grass or an acceptable mulch, more specifically defined as an earth tone, shredded, hardwood product or pine straw which should be refreshed at least once each year.

Weeds, especially in mulched yards, require treatment so they do not detract from the intended natural look of the yard. Leaves and other yard debris need to be raked and/or removed on a seasonal basis, not being left to blow on the street or on other homeowners' properties.

Yard waste must be placed at the end of the residential driveway no sooner than the day before collection. Every effort should be made to conceal and store yard waste out of sight prior to the appropriate pick-up day. Many of you have begun your cleanup but please remember to only place your bags out for pickup no sooner than the day before collection.

Vacant Lot Maintenance

New for 2011 – The Master Association will now oversee the vacant lot maintenance program. Vacant lots will be cleared twice per year in June and October. The Master Association has negotiated a lower cost for the work and owners will now be charged \$50.00 per clearing a reduction of \$10.00 for each clearing. Should you wish to self-clear you must notify Debra Bordeaux (287-1192) no later than May 15.

Sea Trail Strollers Relay For Life Team



Over 40 Sea Trail residents make up the Relay For Life team, the Sea Trail Strollers. So far, the team has sold about 450 purple bows, 35 flags, and over a hundred luminaries. As always our community has been extremely supportive and generous!

The actual Relay will take place at West Brunswick High School on Rte. 130 in Shallotte on May 13 through May 14. The event begins at 5:00pm with a survivor's reception followed by the Survivors' Walk at 6 pm. Following this moving event, teams will have walkers on the track until 11 am on Saturday. The track is surrounded by tents decorated by their teams. Most teams sell food, drinks, or chances on items such as quilts and paintings. Entertainment is provided by area musicians, dancers, and comics.

The Sea Trail Strollers will sell sausage and pepper sandwiches and chicken, lettuce and tomato sandwiches. Lucy Imondi is in charge of refreshments so you know they will be delicious. We will start serving food at five o'clock so come on down to the Relay and bring your appetite. You won't be disappointed! Our team tent will be at the far end of the track – look for our banner.

Two events stand out at the Relay. The first is the Survivor's Walk at 6 pm and the second is the lighting of the luminaries at 9 pm. After that, there will be music, the unwomanly beauty pageant, and lots of fun for the walkers as well as the spectators.

Responsibilities of the Renovation Committee



The Renovation Committee members are Ron Cybyske, Jim Hunt, Bill Miller, and Tom Pickel. The committee was formed to develop the scope of work, accept bids, coordinate, and manage the entire Pink Palace renovation project. Subsequently, the committee responsibilities expanded to include the replacement of door units in the Pink Palace due to the complete deterioration of most of the metal doors. The deterioration was discovered by a certified building inspector.

During the development of the scope of work for the two vacated rooms in the Pink Palace, it was revealed that two of the heat pumps were not working and the existing duct work was inefficient as it was made of a type of material no longer allowed in commercial construction. Also, two of the remaining three units were at least six years old. Finally, the total HVAC was not of sufficient capacity to effectively heat and cool the Pink Palace. The responsibilities of the Renovation Committee expanded further to cover these issues.

We consulted with HVAC, structural engineers and construction professionals as to how best solve the issues confronting us. All the information was summarized and distributed to selected contractors for bids on the project. Bids were reviewed and a proposal with the committee's recommendations was prepared for the STMA Board. The STMA Board approved the proposal and contracts were awarded.

A project calendar was developed to manage the timelines on each phase of the work. Work on Phase 1, HVAC, began on March 28th and included installation of four new heat pumps and the replacement of all duct work in the Pink Palace. Phase 1 was completed on April 4th. Phase 2, room renovation, began on May 1st, starting with the removal of the entire floor in the old spa/sauna room. This demolition was necessary due to the new discovery of outside water damage and the need to conform to new building codes. Completion of Phase 2 should take place on or about June 15. Please note that during Phase 2 it may be necessary to close the Pink Palace pool gate and restrooms to prevent any injury to property owners and guests. This area will be marked off during times of pool closure.

We would like to thank the groups that may have been inconvenienced during the HVAC installations. We appreciate your cooperation. Go to the STMA website for renovation updates during the month of May.
