We will address the impact of the corporation's chapter 11 bankruptcy on the association. We are not in a position to address the corporation's status or to answer questions pertaining to the impact of the bankruptcy on the corporation's operation.

The meeting will start at 10 AM. If you have not already sent in your proxy registration, please arrive early to be recorded as being present. The agenda will be different this year in that there will not be oral presentations of committee reports. Instead, the committee reports are printed elsewhere in this issue of the Sea Trailer. Please read the reports and then if you have any questions, you can direct those questions to the appropriate committee chairperson at the appointed time during the Annual Meeting. ## Rules Committee Reminder

With the summer of 2011 behind us, I would like to take this opportunity to mention renting of your property and your responsibilities if you would have a tenant occupy your property. At times this summer properties in our community were rented on a short term, usually for a week at a time and in some cases causing disruption to the adjoining neighbors. Copies of the By-laws, the Architectural Design Standards (ADS), and the Rules & Regulations Handbook are available on the STMA website [www.mapost.org](http://www.mapost.org).

If you are an owner and are renting your unit on a long-term basis, three (3) months or more, you must provide a copy these documents to your tenants and ensure they understand their obligation to adhere to the Rules & Regulations.

General: For the purpose of these Rules & Regulations, a tenant shall be defined as anyone in possession of a property owner's house in exchange for any sort of consideration unless otherwise approved by the STMA Board.

- A. Status: Tenants of property owners are not members of STMA. However, they are subject to the STMA By-laws, and the Rules & Regulations Handbooks that govern STMA and its common areas.
- B. Responsibility: Property owners are responsible for the actions of their tenants and tenant's guests and will be held financially liable for any damage to STMA's common areas and equipment. The property owners will also be held liable, financially or otherwise, for any violations of the MD, the By-laws, the Rules & Regulations by their tenant and/or tenant's guests.

- D. TERM: A "single family" residence may not be leased or rented for a term less than ninety (90) days. Any variance to this must be presented to the Master Association for approval.

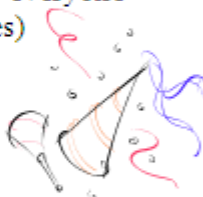

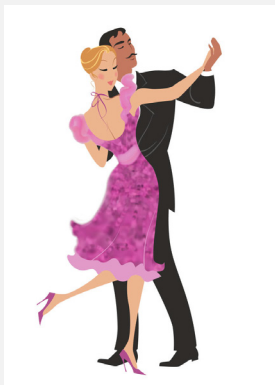

## Road Maintenance Committee Report

The Road Maintenance Committee was formed in August. Members are: Wayne Hellmann, Tom Glick, Wendell Booth and Paul Horgan. Chuck Helmboldt is acting in an advisory capacity to the committee.

The primary responsibilities of this committee are: Monitoring street lighting, entrance lighting and guardhouse lighting to insure proper operation, coordinate repairs and /or improvements, Checking road conditions with emphasis on roads not dedicated to the Town of Sunset Beach, coordinate road improvements, maintaining / improving guardhouses at all entrances.

The committee has sectioned off Sea Trail with each member taking responsibility for a sector. Wayne has everything South of Calabash Creek, Paul has Oyster Pointe, Wendell has West of Clubhouse Road and Tom has East of Clubhouse Road.

To date the committee has been in contact with the town regarding several potholes; we are pleased to report that a number of the potholes have been filled. We have also contacted Brunswick Electric regarding several street lights that were not functioning. Those situations have also been corrected, as well.

It is the committee's intention to collect information regarding road conditions and to periodically approach the town with a list of problems, so as not to be requesting service every time an issue comes to our attention. This will also be the case for the roads that have not been dedicated to the town. Except in cases where there is a significant safety concern. Those issues will be addressed immediately.

## Landscaping Report for 2011

I am pleased to report that your landscape committee and the Master Association (MA) Board have again approved the continued service of Phoenix Landscape Inc. for 2012. Phoenix continues to do an outstanding job, and they are always responsive to all MA concerns. They work closely with the committee to develop detailed landscape designs and/or upgrades and do an outstanding job on the flower designs for our entrances and facilities. Also, I would like to thank our landscape representatives for all their contributions this past year. They are: Sue Beebe, John Goodrich, Katie Bodner, Pat DeMattia, Chuck Helmboldt, John Johnsen and Ed Kazan. Special thanks to Tom Plankers, our Board representative, for his advice and guidance.

This past year has been somewhat of a challenge to our landscaping. Early in the summer we had to stop using the golf course water sources to irrigate our landscaping. The golf course water ponds provide all the water to irrigate the MA landscaping and when we have a drought, the golf course irrigation demands are primary and our demands become secondary. When this happens, all MA irrigation must be turned off. Fortunately, we anticipated this would likely happen sometime so the MA established a county water irrigation system for all of our landscaping. This summer was the first time we had to operate totally on the county water system. With the lower pressure county system, we found that some irrigated areas did not receive adequate or full coverage, and some of the flowers and shrubs suffered. The Committee will be evaluating the overall irrigation systems and the county water problems as we move forward to see what adjustments will have to be made to insure adequate coverage when using only county water.

Other than the irrigation problems, the committee was very pleased with this year's landscaping results. The MA areas throughout Sea Trail were kept to their usual clean cut appearance, our facilities looked outstanding and the flowers were very showy until the drought hit. We started off with the largest project, the landscaping of the new Creek Side Building and continued on with landscape upgrades at Oyster Pointe, some in Sugar Sands, installing palms along Crooked Gulley and a few upgrades at the Pink Palace and the MAC. Also, Tom Plankers has been working with an area golf designer to come up with a more modern design for the entrance walls. A new entrance design concept has been presented to the Board, but it was put on hold for the immediate future. All in all it was a very good year.

We have planned several landscape upgrades for 2012. They include a re-landscaping of the Kings Trail median, new landscaping at Eastwood Park entrance (result of storm water drain construction), installing shrub beds between the palms along Crooked Gulley, and some new plantings and mulching in the Tabby Walk (South Entrance) area. A few other smaller projects are also planned.

Finally, thanks to all of you that have contacted our committee with your concerns and suggestions regarding the MA landscaping. Together, we will continue to make our landscaping something we all can be very proud of here at Sea Trail.

This is a very hand on committee that helps maintain the security of our multimillion dollar property investment.

After the Pink Palace was remodeled, and the new building was opened, we setup and scheduled the Multi-purpose, Sunset and Seahorse rooms. This included moving some groups from the MAC, the main room at the Pink Palace and helping those groups that had used the library. In addition, the calendar on the Master Association web site was updated to reflect all room usage. The Master Association web site calendar will be the only place where meeting schedules will be confirmed. When looking to schedule a room, verify its availability on the web site. Along with this an improved process was implemented to schedule rooms.

The new building required a great amount of work by the access committee. Led by Tom Pickel, the group provided for instillation, door locks, security access, handicapped equipped doors and video cameras. In addition the fire alarm system was installed under their guidance. We also received approval to install a surge protector at the beach parking lot. This request was the results of a gate malfunction in June. The MAC pool gate was repaired - the lock and closer were replaced and the gate was spot welded and repainted. And, public Wi-Fi was installed at the MAC and Pink Palace.
