Like just about everywhere in the country, it has been hot in Sunset Beach. Fortunately for us, we can jump into one of our pools or go cool

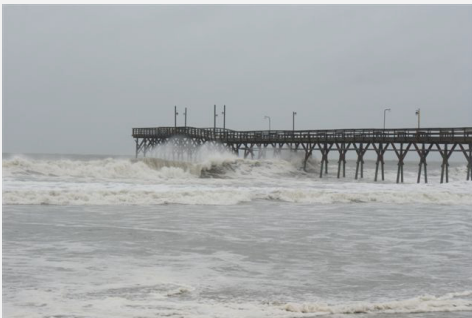

## Rules for the Preservation of Trees

Many times over the years, the Rules Committee has been asked to intervene in the removal or process for removal of a tree either on an improved or unimproved property. As you will see below, the Sea Trail Master Association "Design Standards" have done a good job of making the committee's job easier and what follows is taken directly from the Design Standards. In "*Item L.3., 4. & 5 Preservation of Trees*" it states:

3. For trees located on requesting owners' improved property:
  - i. ASC will have the tree assessed and note relevant circumstances. Criteria for approval may include but not be limited to:
    - dead or diseased tree
    - removal required to safeguard the health of adjacent trees
    - a compromised root system
  - ii. Decision is made and a written report is provided to the property owner.
  - iii. If approved for removal, property owner makes arrangements for removal and payment.
  - iv. In some instances, ASC may grant approval contingent upon property owner's agreement to replace removed tree with a suitable hardwood.
  
4. For trees located on an undeveloped lot:
  - i. Town of Sunset Beach zoning code relating to the Preservation of Trees requires that regulated trees not be removed from private property "except for parcels occupied by a single family detached dwelling". Trees on undeveloped lots fall under the jurisdiction of the Town's code.

- ii. If a homeowner in Sea Trail has a concern about a tree(s) on an adjacent undeveloped lot, it is said owner's responsibility to contact the owner of the adjacent undeveloped lot. If the owner of the undeveloped lot agrees to remove the tree(s) then the owner must contact the town of Sunset Beach and Sea Trail Master Association, ASC, for the proper permits.
  
5. Under no circumstances will Sea Trail Corporation or the Master Association be financially responsible for the removal of any tree located on private property.

For a complete official text or clarification see the STMA Design Standards which are posted on the website under the Important Documents tab or feel free to call the ASC Administrator, Debra Bordeaux.

## Sea Trail Gourmet Club September/October Dinner

Are you looking for an easy way to have a dinner party? Consider joining the Sea Trail Gourmet Club. The meal planned for Sept/Oct will feature Marinated Shrimp, Corn Chowder, Filet of Flounder stuffed with Crab Meat, Carrot Pudding, and Old-Fashioned Rice Pudding.
