- Invest funds and manage cash flow
- Review and audit bank statements
- Monitor invoice payments

Bob performed these tasks and others as smoothly as watching Tiger Woods make a putt. He improved on the accounting system, financial controls, cash management and bank relations especially during these difficult financial times.

While Bob has left the board, he has agreed to become our Assistant Treasurer in charge of banking and investments while our new treasurer, John Rothermel, assumes the other functions of his new post.

Card Access Committee

During June and July the Card Access committee completed the installation of all electrical devices necessary to support the new system. The committee also defined the information necessary for the automated portion of the system and developed a test plan to support the activities necessary for a successful implementation. New policies and procedures for card issuance and replacement were approved by the Master Association Board at the July meeting.

During August, we will continue to test the access card system capabilities for access to Master Association facilities. The card distribution plan will also be developed during August and we will install phone lines necessary to operate the system and validate card access. The new Access cards will be distributed the first two weekends in September. Please watch for posted notices, at Jones/Byrd and Maples clubhouses, broadcast email, and the Master Association website regarding time and place you can pick up your card. A picture ID will be required to obtain your card. If you are unable to get a card during those times, they will be available at the Master Association office during normal business hours beginning September 14, 2009. Access Cards WILL NOT be mailed. Our current plans call for converting and testing all facilities during the week of September 28, 2009. Committee members will be on site as we go through the conversion process to answer question and ensure a smooth transition to the new system. The committee asks for your patience and cooperation during the conversion.

Until the conversion is completed GOLD cards and applicable WHITE cards will continue to be used to gain access to facilities.

We will continue to provide monthly updates as to our progress. If you have any questions regarding the conversion, please contact any of the committee members: Ron Cybyske, Walter Marsh, Tom Pickel, and Neil Weiss.

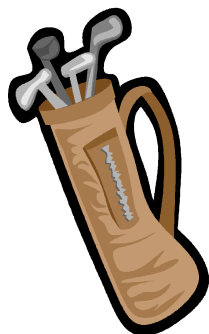

Leaf and Limb Pick-Up

How would you like to your yard clean-up chore a little easier and save at least \$25.00 per year in the process? Are you aware that the Town of Sunset Beach Leaf & Limb pick-up program allows you to use 30 gallon re-useable trash cans for the yard debris program? Are you aware that the mulch created by the program is available for you to pick-up at no charge at the Public Works building behind the firehouse?

The bio-degradable bags most of you are using cost about \$.50 each (excluding the sealing tape and the trips to the store to purchase them) they hold about 20 gallons of yard waste material and require an extra set of hands to fill at the work site and are used once. The bags also pose a problem during periods of inclement weather Re-useable trash cans cost about \$10.00 each hold 30 gallons of yard waste material and sit open and erect for easy filling at the job site, last at least 3-5 years and can be nested for storage.

Assuming you have 60 gallons of yard waste every two weeks over a 3 year period you will use 216 bio-degradable bags at a cost of \$108.00; the same yard waste can be handled by (2) 30 gallon trash cans at a cost of \$20.00 saving you \$88.00 over the 3 years.

I know many of you place many more then 3 bags at curbside for a given pick-up, but don't put something out for every pick-up. Using the trash cans you can perform a little yard clean-up whenever you can and just store the debris out of sight in the cans until your next pick-up thereby eliminating the need for a massive clean-up activity at any one time. Performing your yard work this way will allow you to operate effectively with 2 or 3 cans. Remove the paper from the mulch, and reducing the peak load volumes of debris will also help the Town employees to complete the pick-ups throughout the Town as scheduled.

I hope this information will be helpful to you.
