It is almost time for the annual Sea Trail Master Association meeting to be held on Saturday, November 13, at 10 a.m. in the Jones Byrd conference room. This year for the first time the Songbirds will be present to open the meeting. You will meet the chairpersons of our committees, hear a 2011 budget presentation and have the opportunity to ask questions and make comments to the board.

The Master Association amended the insurance requirement for service providers. Effective October, service providers such as personal trainers, yoga instructors and other such activities, will need to name the Master Association as an additional insured on a liability policy of at least \$500,000. Proof of insurance must be given to Debra Bordeaux, Administrator for the Master Association who resides in the Real Estate Office.

Several property owners have inquired about obtaining Sea Trail license plates for the front bumper of their cars. Be advised that Sea Trail is planning to sell the license plates in the near future in the pro shops.

The Master Association intends to produce a membership directory once again. Directories will not be mailed as had been done in the past. It is our intent to have members distribute directories to those living locally and to ask those who reside in Sea Trail part time to pick up directories in the association office. This will save the association approximately \$1,500. Notice will be given when the directories have been printed.

I look forward to seeing you at the annual meeting on November 13!

Reminder: On **Saturday, October 9th** at the Palm Court Events Center tent behind the convention center, Sea Trail will hold a plant sale exclusively for homeowners. This cash only event begins at 9 a.m. and ends at 11 a.m. or when all the plants have been sold. Potted pansies (4") will be sold for \$2 each. Parking will be in the gravel area between the convention center and the Champions buildings.

Rules

The Rules Committee after reviewing requests and suggestions for clarification of several rules proposed three amendments to the Board. The amendments were approved by the Board at their recent meeting on September 15, 2010. Per the Board the amendments are effectively immediately.

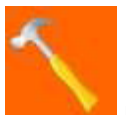
Amendment 1 & 2: Note that regarding the reservation process for the Pink Palace/MAC Facilities the following amendments have been approved and will be included under the "Pink Palace/MAC Facilities" Page 14

1. The reserving owner must be present for the event.
2. Facilities are intended for property owners and their houseguests only.

Also as a reminder when reserving the facilities, note that the pools cannot be reserved.

Amendment 3: Regarding rental of properties the Board approved the following amendment. "Tenants Page 7": Term. A "single family" residence may not be leased or rented for a term less than ninety (90) days. Any variance to this must be presented to the Master Association for approval.

The Rules Committee meets on a regular basis and may propose amendments from time to time throughout the year. Additionally an annual review of the complete document will take place and a revised document will be posted on the website after the first Board meeting of the new year. Keep these amendments handy throughout the year. Time for the Wag Shag!

Have you shagged your wag? Or, have you wagged your shag? Many of us who enjoy the beautiful life here at Sea Trail are unaware that once a year, Sea Trail is the site of a fun, novel event called The Wag Shag. Sea Trail's Convention Center sets up its huge, 9,200 square foot air conditioned tent, and hosts hundreds of humans and their dogs for a fun afternoon of games, contests, and a wonderful buffet luncheon (for the humans, that is) as a fundraising event for Paws Ability.

Paws Ability is a nonprofit 501-C3 group, headquartered on Ocean Isle Beach, that raises funds that are then distributed throughout Brunswick County's animal shelters. Last October, they hosted over 225 humans and 86 dogs at this annual fundraiser. Over 10 dogs were adopted there at the Wag Shag by dog lovers who were able to find places in their hearts and their homes for a dog. For these homeless pooches, the Wag Shag was their life changing event!

The first Wag Shag was held in 2008. As luck would have it, the day arrived with a huge downpour of rain. John Humphries and his staff acted quickly. They moved the entire event inside the Convention Center, dogs and all! The very next day, the Center was booked for a formal dinner dance. The staff managed to clean up from the Wag Shag festivities and transform the space into a beautifully decorated ballroom in time for the cotillion the next day. Those guests could not have imagined that just a few short hours before, the space had been filled with rollicking dogs of all shapes, sizes, and personalities.

Last year, the Wag Shag was conveniently near Halloween, and several guests brought their dogs dressed for the occasion. That gave the Paws Ability folks an idea: Hey, why not make this the theme each year? People obviously enjoyed dressing up their pooches, and the dogs seemed to know that it was a party especially for them.

"Rescued" dogs are the focus of Wag Shag. These are dogs that had been homeless, for any one of many reasons, and are then adopted through one of the county's shelters or rescue and foster organizations. In the pictures shown here from last year's Wag Shag, one features Allen Doolittle holding their latest addition to the family, Bella. Bella is an adorable Yorkie that Allen and Charlene had agreed to foster until Bella was ready for a "forever home." As you can see in the photo, Bella quickly decided that her forever home was with the Doolittles!

Another set of rescued poodles, Ginger and Pepper, were brought by their humans, Pat and Bob Diehl. The poodles ages and backgrounds are uncertain, since they were abandoned along a road in Pender County. The dogs were inseparable, and it's theorized that they're a mother-daughter pair, and they had to be adopted together. As soon as Pat saw their picture featured in one of the newspapers, she knew they were the dogs for them! She and Bob gave them new names, and a new life!

All rescued dogs in attendance at the Wag Shag receive a yellow ribbon, acknowledging their status. The dogs can participate in games, if they want to, and get their pictures taken, and socialize with other dogs and their humans.

Tobin Henry serves as Master of Ceremonies. There are many contests for the dogs and their humans, including Best Costume, Best Kisser, Best Tail Wagger, Best Smile, Best Hair, the Smallest Dog, the Largest Dog, and So Your Dog's Got Talent?

Amy VanDyne is a dog trainer who works out of the Southport area. She often helps shelters with their "problem children." Amy has helped over 20 shelter dogs correct behavioral problems and learn social skills, making it possible for them to be adopted into loving, forever homes. She will be there again this year, demonstrating behavior modification and obedience techniques.

Then, there's Netop the Painting Dog. "Netop" is an Indian word meaning "friend." He was also a rescue dog who proved himself to be very energetic and talented. Among other things, his human taught him to hold a paint brush and paint colorful contemporary pictures which are then sold or auctioned. Netop donates the proceeds from the sales of his paintings to rescue groups as his way of giving back to the community that helped him find his forever home.
